

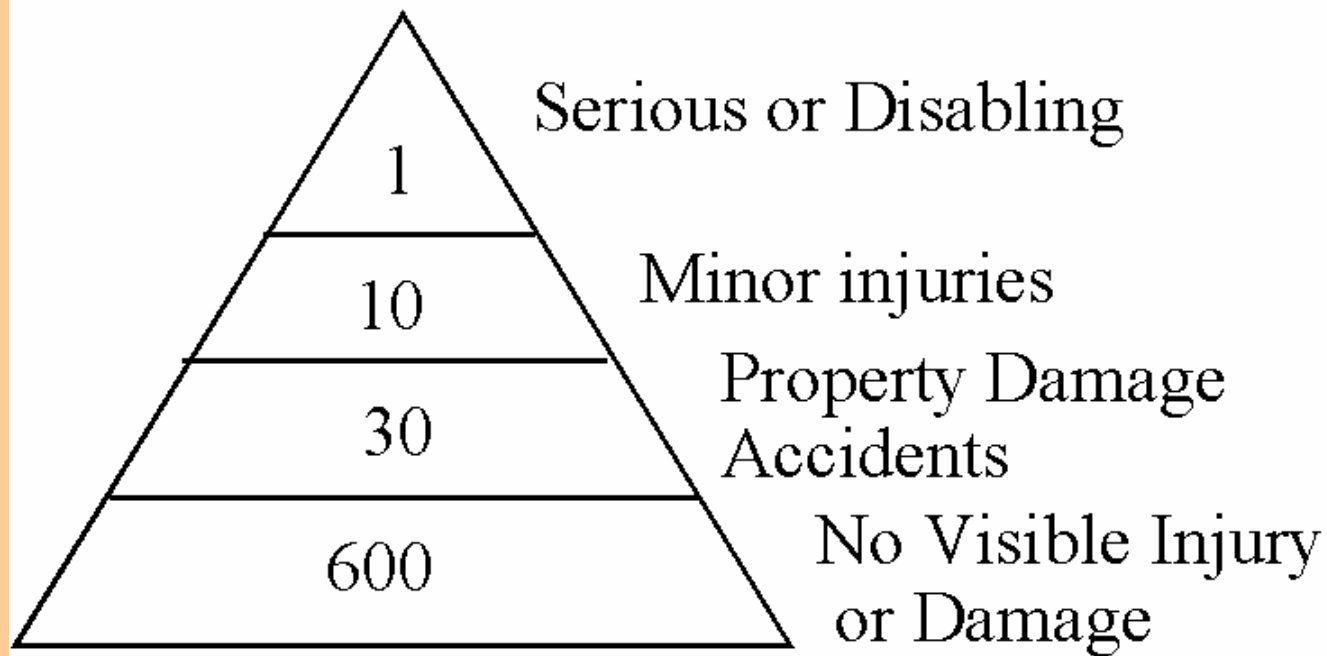

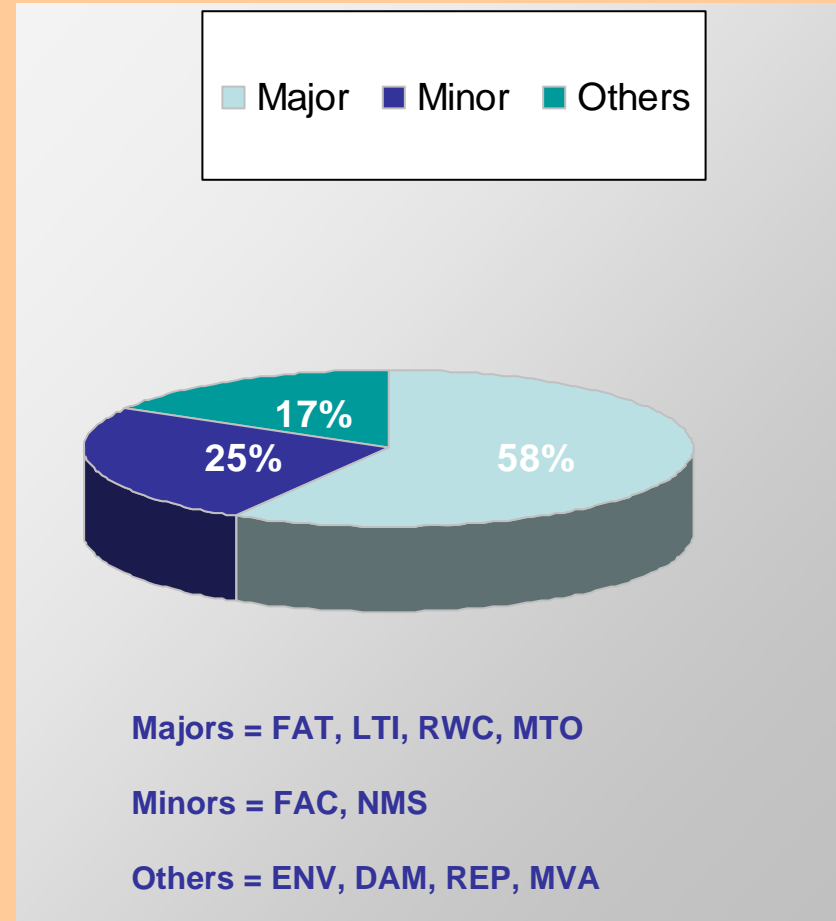

The wake up call

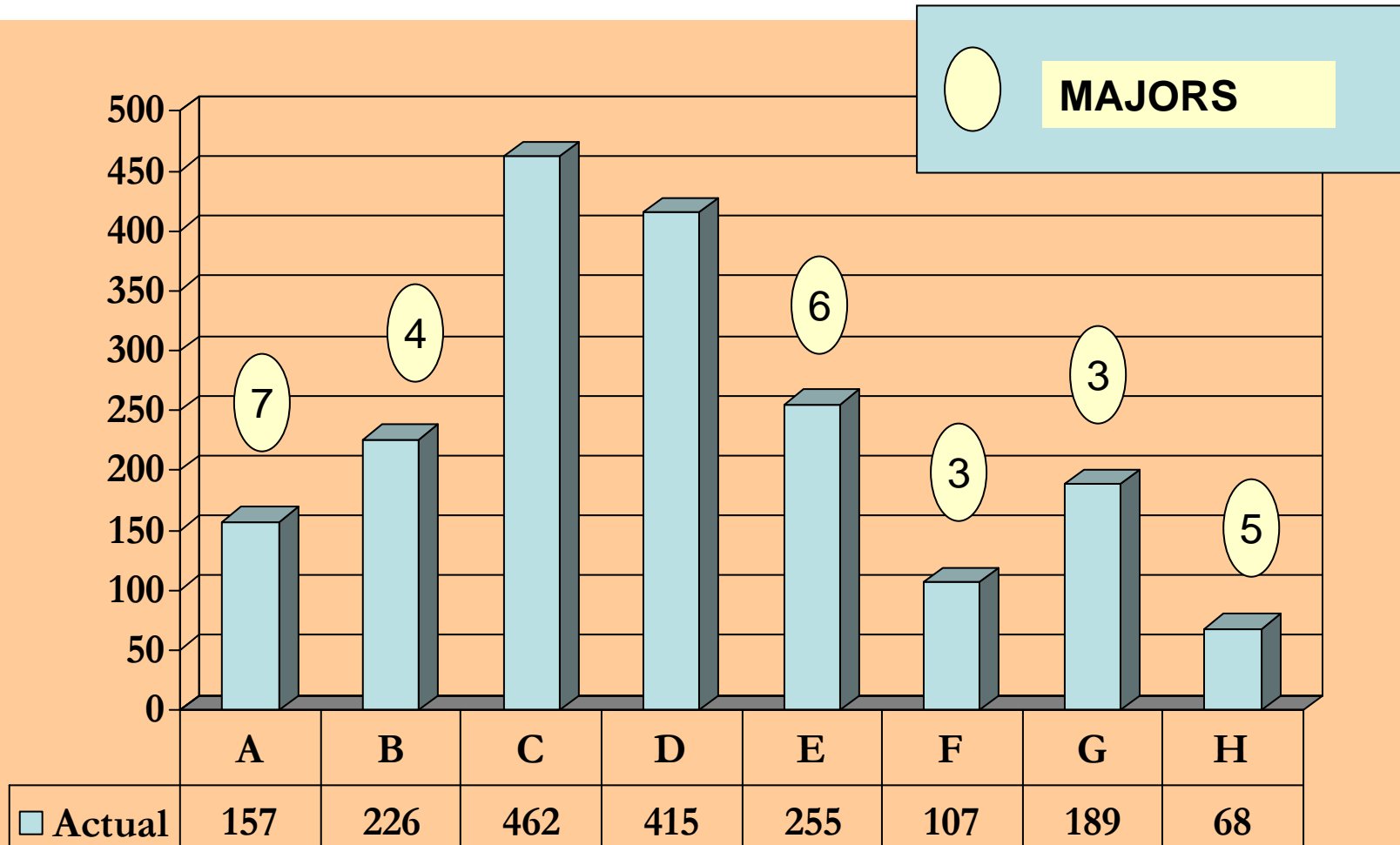
- Rig safety statistics

 - 7 Majors Incidents (FAT, LTI, RWC, MTO)
 - 2 Minors (FAC, NMS)
 - 3 Others (ENV, MVA, Report Only)

(Jun – Dec 2004)

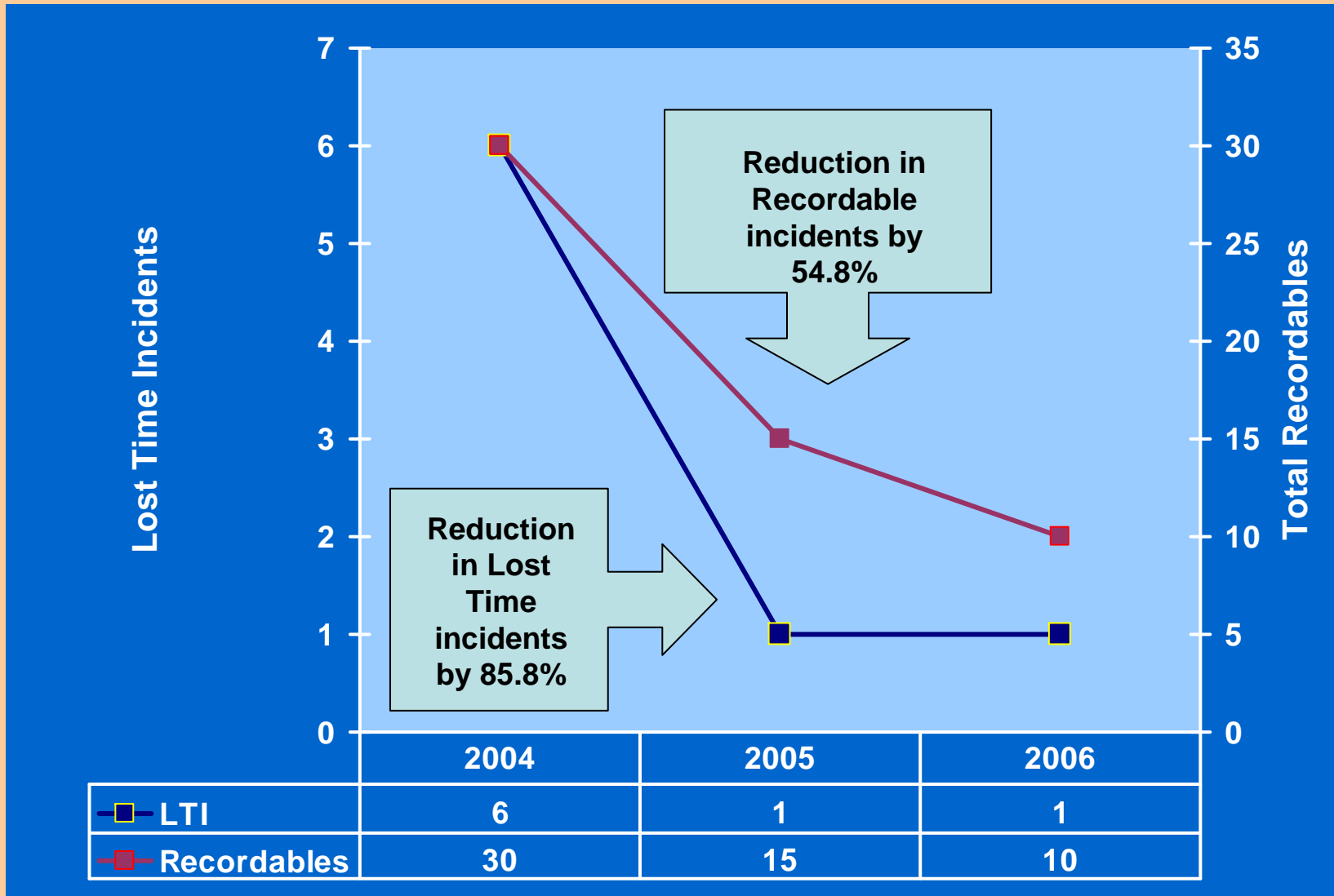




Key for success?

- The reporting of incidents increased by 50 percent on compared to those reported in 2004.
- We saw an increase by 43 percent in First Aid Cases reporting in 2005 to date compared to 2004.
- We saw an increase by 36 percent in Near Miss reporting in 2005 to date compared to 2004.
- By year end 2004 we had 3826 STOP Cards submitted across the eight rigs. As of 31st December we have had 7528 or 49 percent increase.

What were the results



What were the results

- **Lost Time Incident Frequency rate** at year end 2005 was 0.47 compared to 3.43 at year end 2004.
- This is a **85.8%** decrease and inside our projected target of a 20% reduction or <2.8.
- In actual LTI's we had 1 compared to 6 last year.
- Our **Total Recordable Frequency Rate** (Fat, LTI, MTO and RWC) at years end 2005 was 7.88 compared to 15.85 at year end 2004.
- This is a **54.8%** decrease and inside our projected target of a 20% reduction or <13.72.
- In actual recordables we have had 16 this year compared to 30 last year.

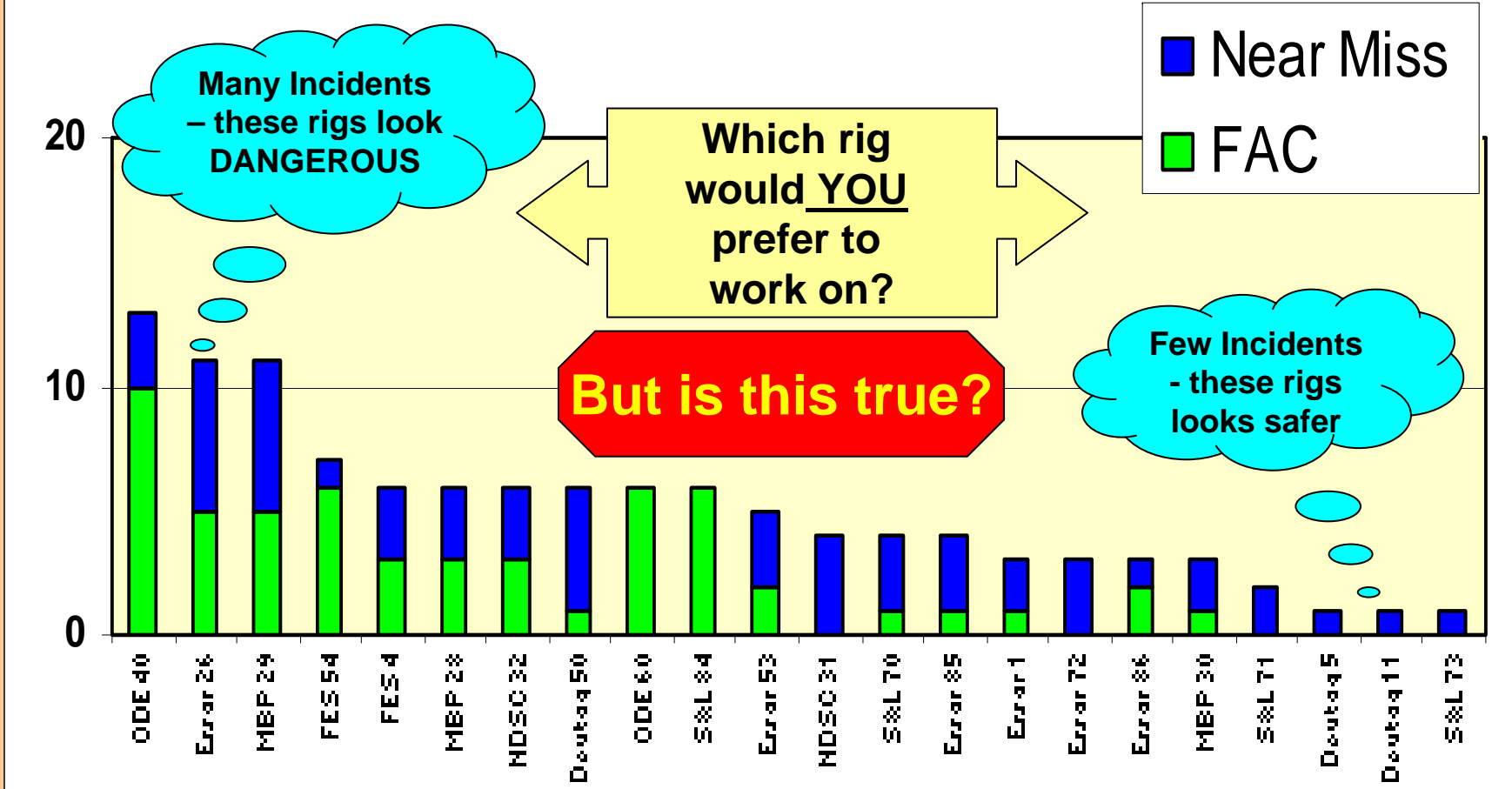

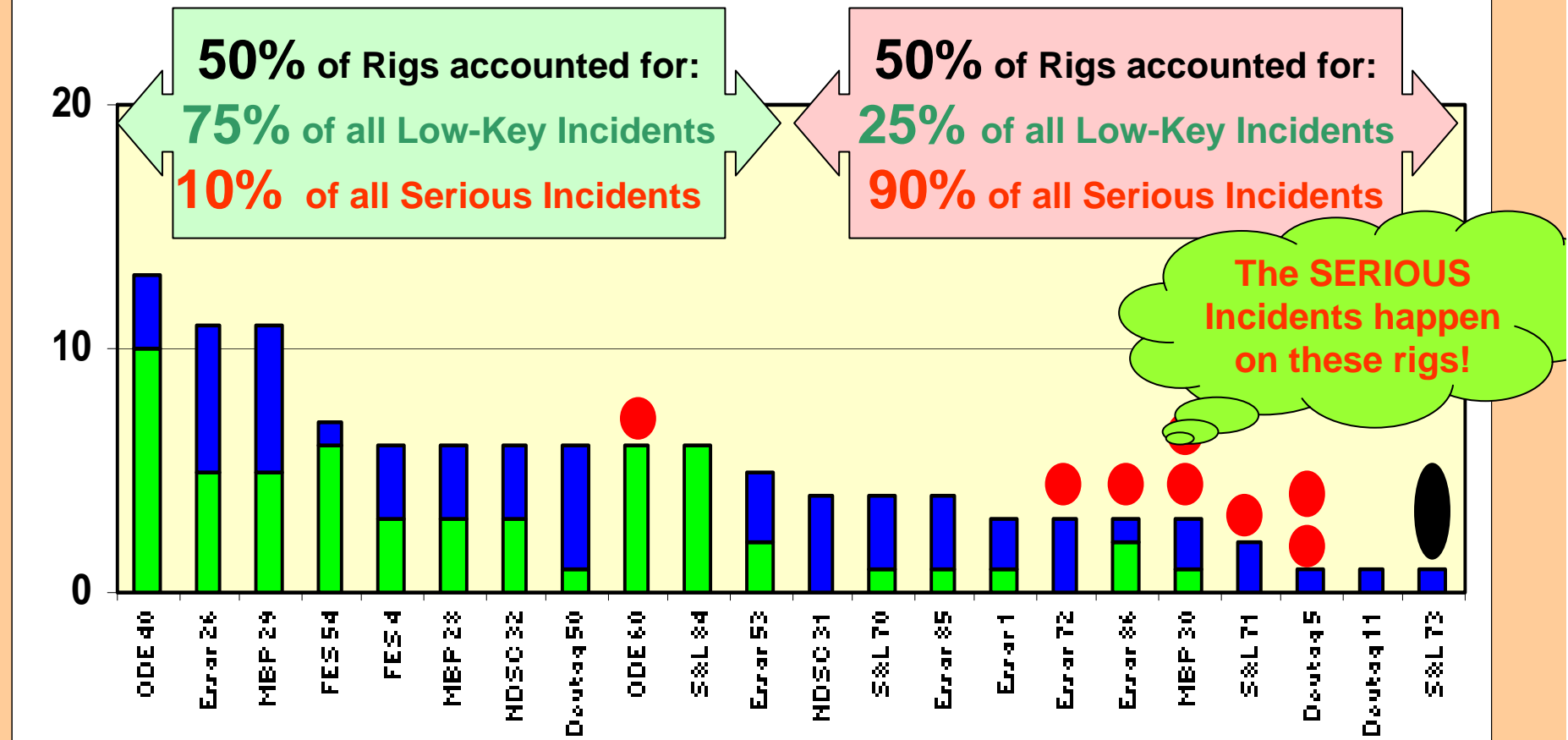

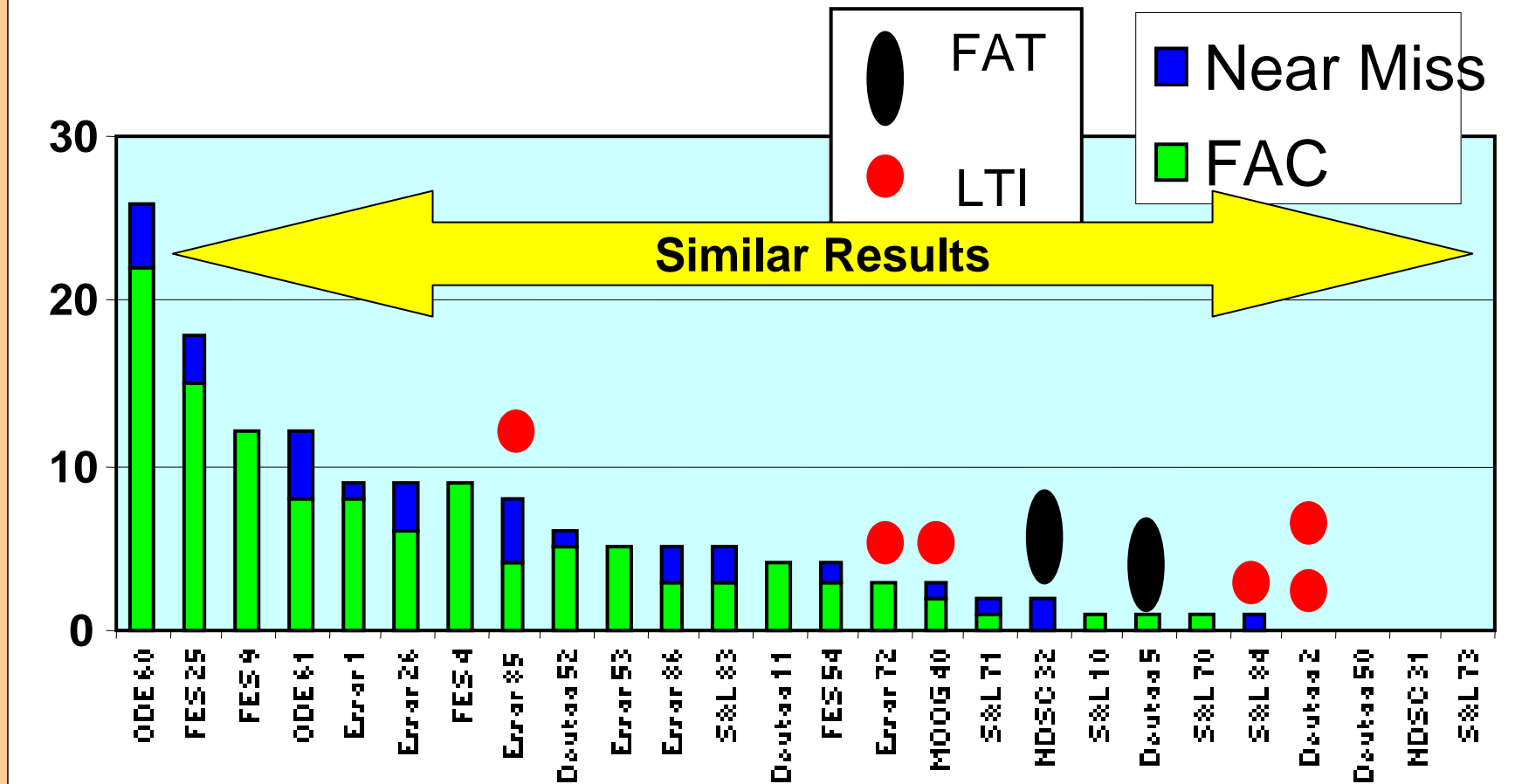
Low-Key vs. Serious Incidents, 1/7/2000 - 30/6/2001

In closing

- Regions, Companies and Rigs have varying “Incident Reporting Cultures”
 - I suspect low key incidents are happening, but are not being reported
- Rigs that report more minor incidents (FAC & NM) tend to have fewer Incidents
 - Encourage reporting of all incidents – don’t shoot the messenger
- Rigs that report fewer minor incidents appear more likely to have a serious incident
- We should focus on operations that do NOT routinely report minor incidents – less focus on those that do
 - No news it not always good news

- We need to monitor measure Minors Vs Majors.
In my opinion Frank E Bird's Safety Pyramid does work
- Better communications of incidents which do occur.
- Focus on severity of incidents not the type of incident.
- Don't just investigate major incidents. Remember learning from minors should prevent majors.
